CAREY AMONG 2,000 AT BELKIN FUNERAL

Governor Carey and State Attorney General Louis J. Lefkowitz were among 2,000 mourners who attended the funeral for Dr. Samuel Belkin yesterday.

Dr. Belkin, chancellor of Yeshiva University, died Sunday at the age of 64.

At the services, held in the Nathan Lempert Auditorium of the university, 185th Street and Amsterdam Avenue, Dr. Joseph B. Soloveitchik, professor of Talmud, who delivered the eulogy, said of Dr. Belkin, "He was a dreamer like Joseph, and he dreamt of a generation of young American Jews who could combine both an excellent Torah education with participation in a scientifically oriented American society."

Others among the mourners included Representative Bella S. Abzug, Manhattan Democrat; Percy E. Sutton, Manhattan Borough President, and Robert Abrams, Bronx Borough President.

WASHINGTON, April 20—William Gilmore Costil Jr., a backer of Broadway and other theatrical enterprises, died at Doctor's Hospital here yesterday. He was 63 years old.

Among his investments was "Gentlemen Prefer Blondes." He directed and acted in the Guild Hall Players at the John Drew Theater in East Hampton, L.I., and was founder and director of the Middleburg (Va.) Players.

Mr. Costil is survived by his wife, the former Jean Whitney; four sons and two grandchildren.
