


Detroit Rabbi Will Head Religious Zionist Group

ATLANTIC CITY, Jan. 1.—
Rabbi Isaac Stollman of Detroit has been elected president of the newly formed American Religious Zionist Organization of America, it was announced today.

The choice of Rabbi Stollman, leader of Congregation Mishkan Israel and head of the Council of Orthodox Rabbis of Greater Detroit, ended the five-day meeting of the merger convention here. Two religious Zionist groups, the Mizrahi Organization of America and the Hapoel Hamizrachi of America, merged to coordinate their activities here and in Israel.

Other officers elected included Rabbi Joseph B. Solovitchik of Boston, honorary president; Dr. Bernard Bergman and Rabbi Mordecai Kirshblum of New York, honorary chairman; Samson Krupnik, Chicago, chairman of the executive board; Israel Berman, New York, treasurer; Jesse Eisen, Spring Valley, N. Y., co-treasurer; Joseph Sokolow, New York, secretary.
